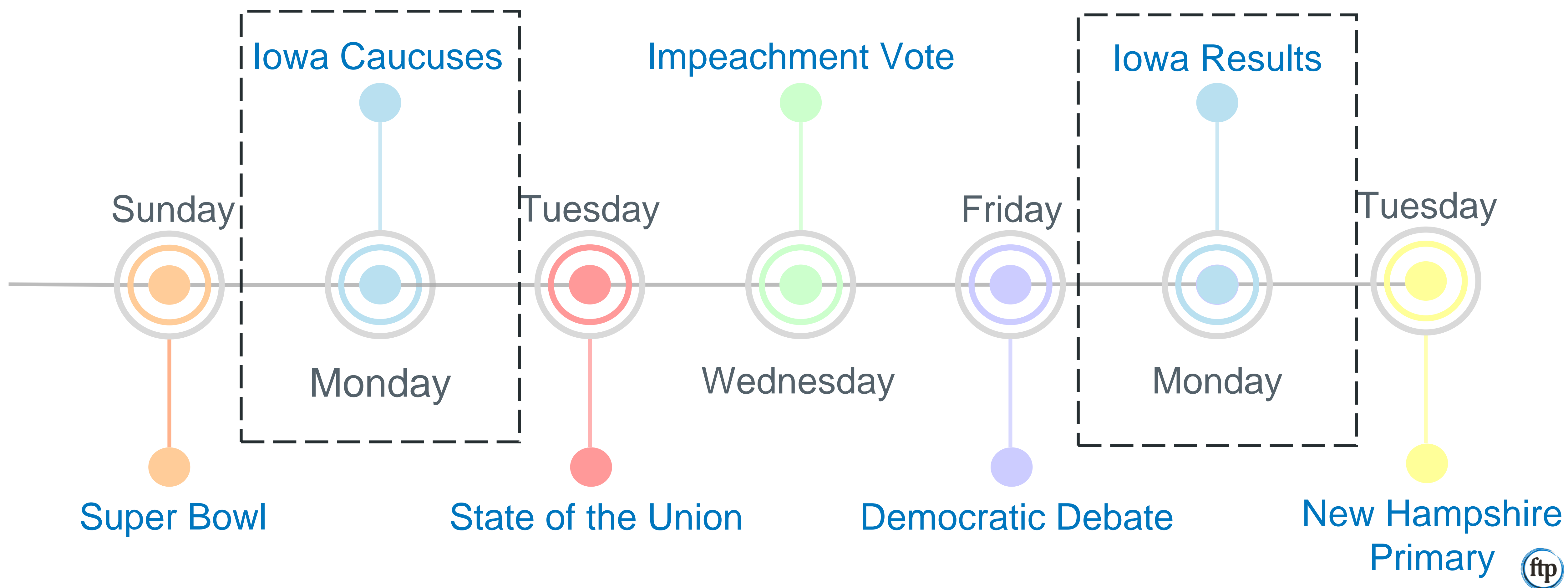

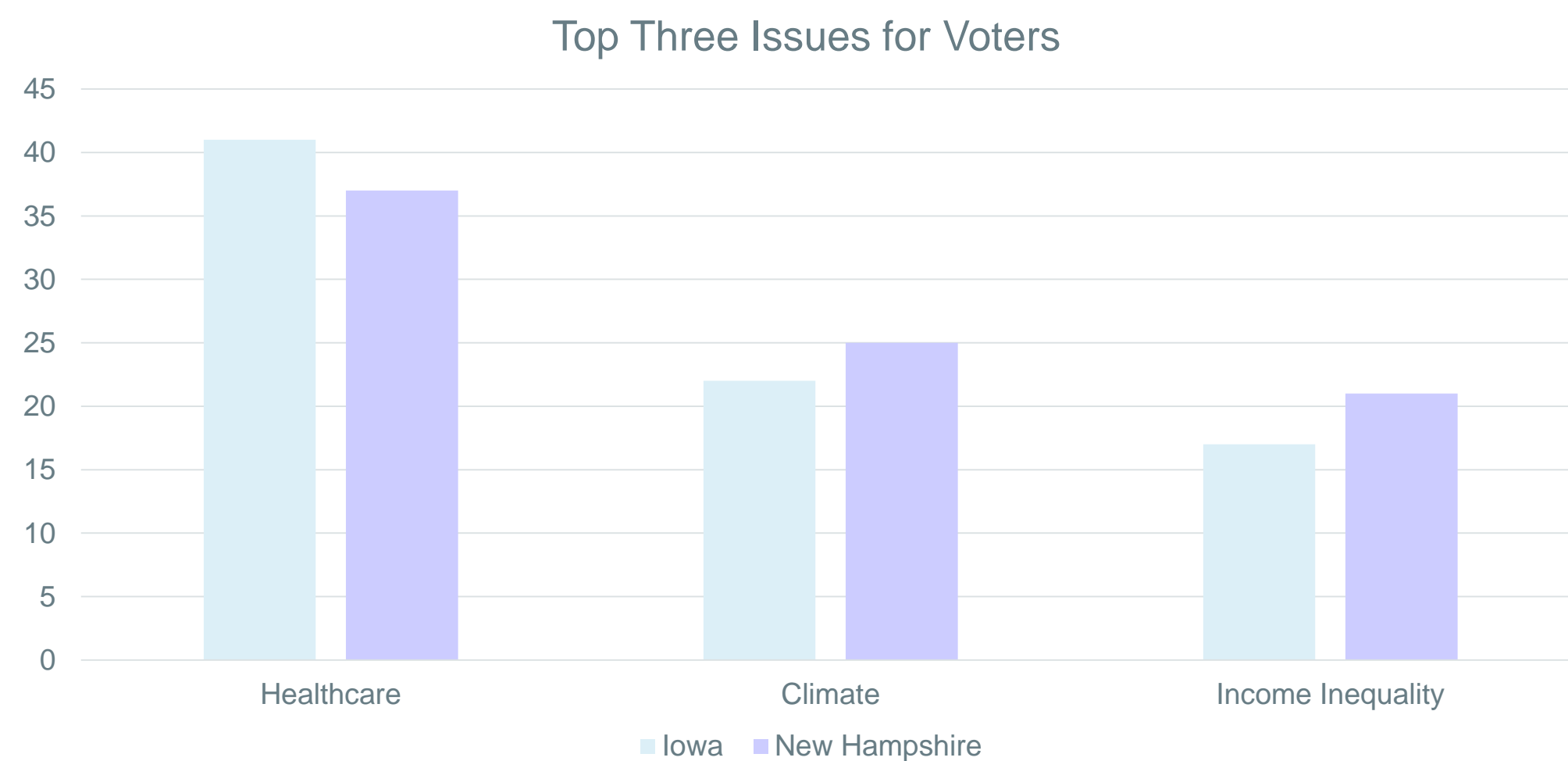

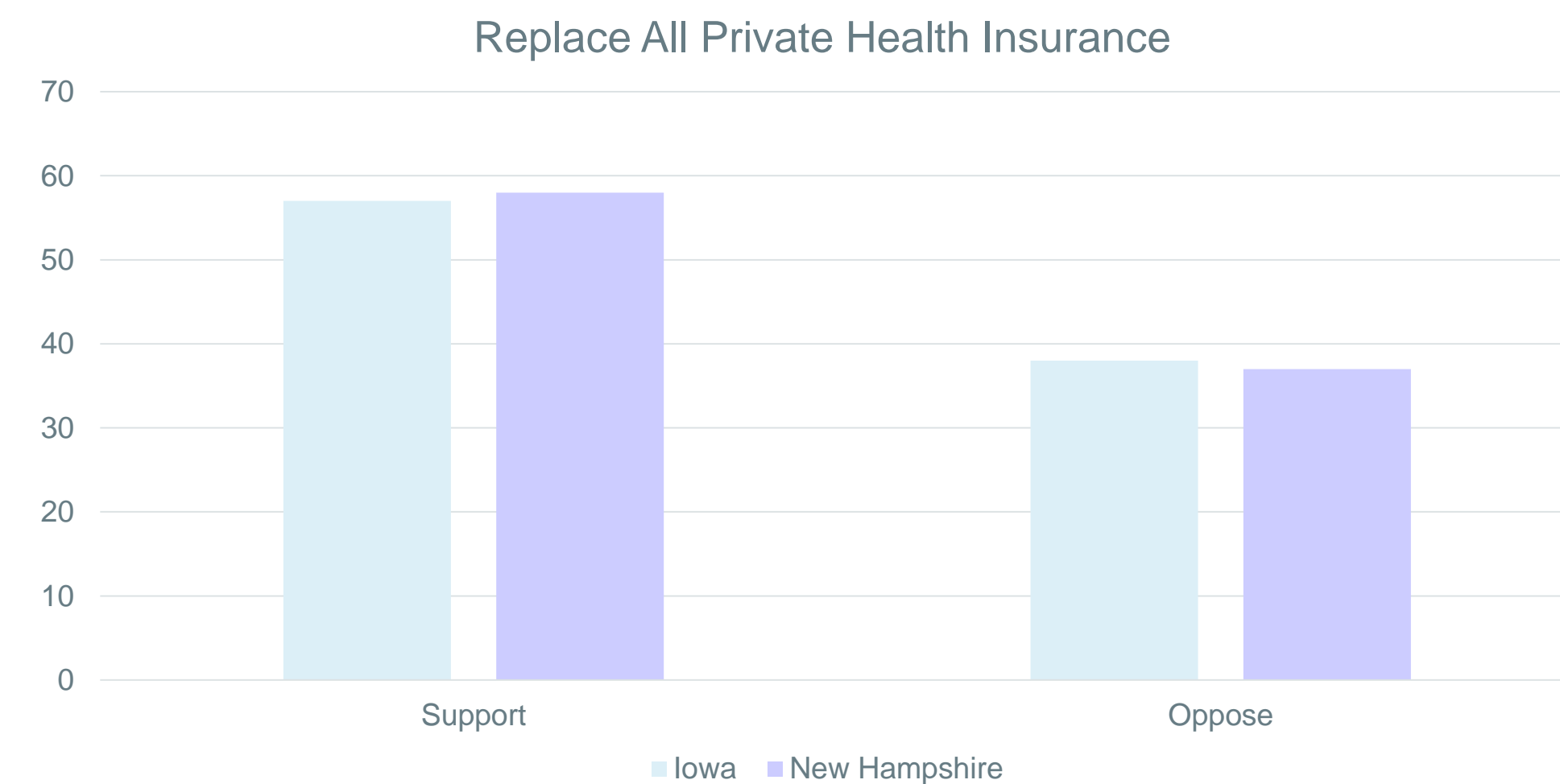


## Key Takeaways – Healthcare

Healthcare emerged as the dominant issue, with polls in both states showing voters ranking it as the most important issue by a substantial margin.



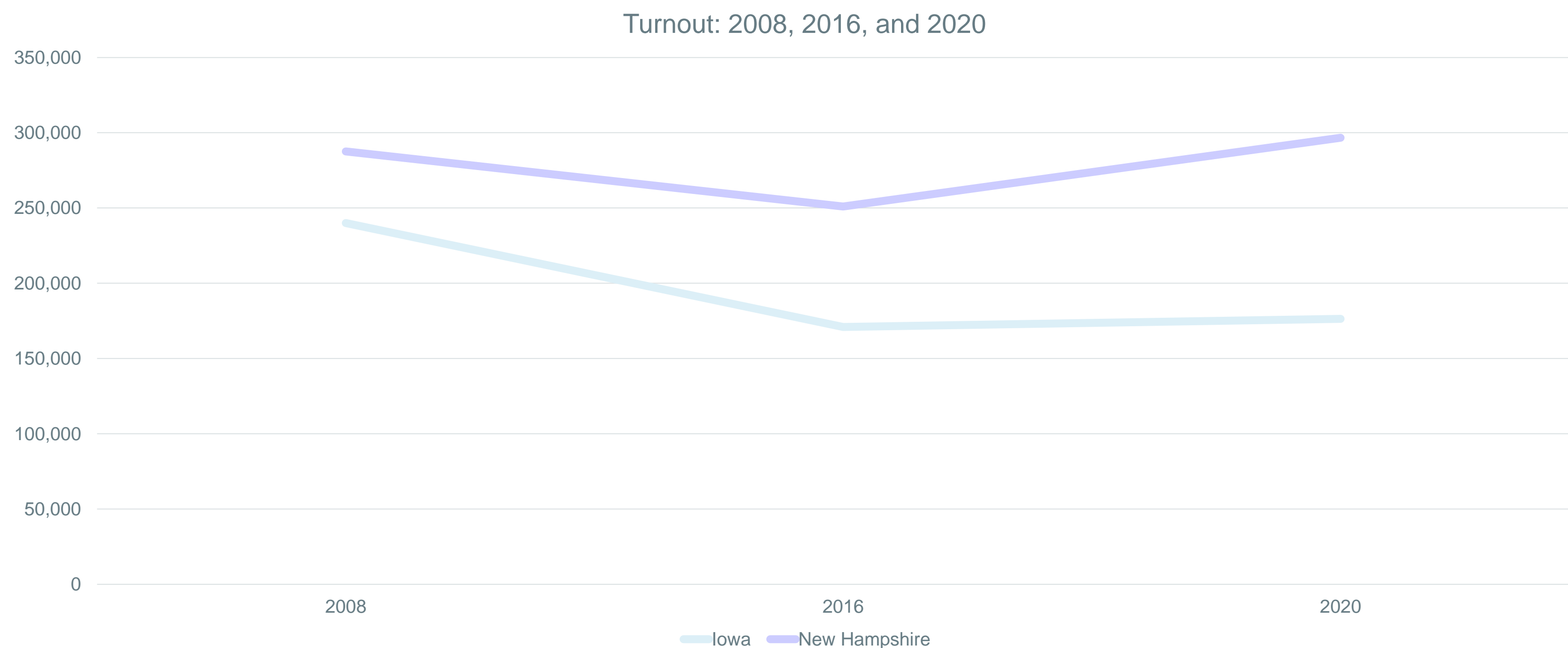
The progressive bent of the electorate in each state was on display, with majorities supporting replacing all private health insurance with a single government plan.





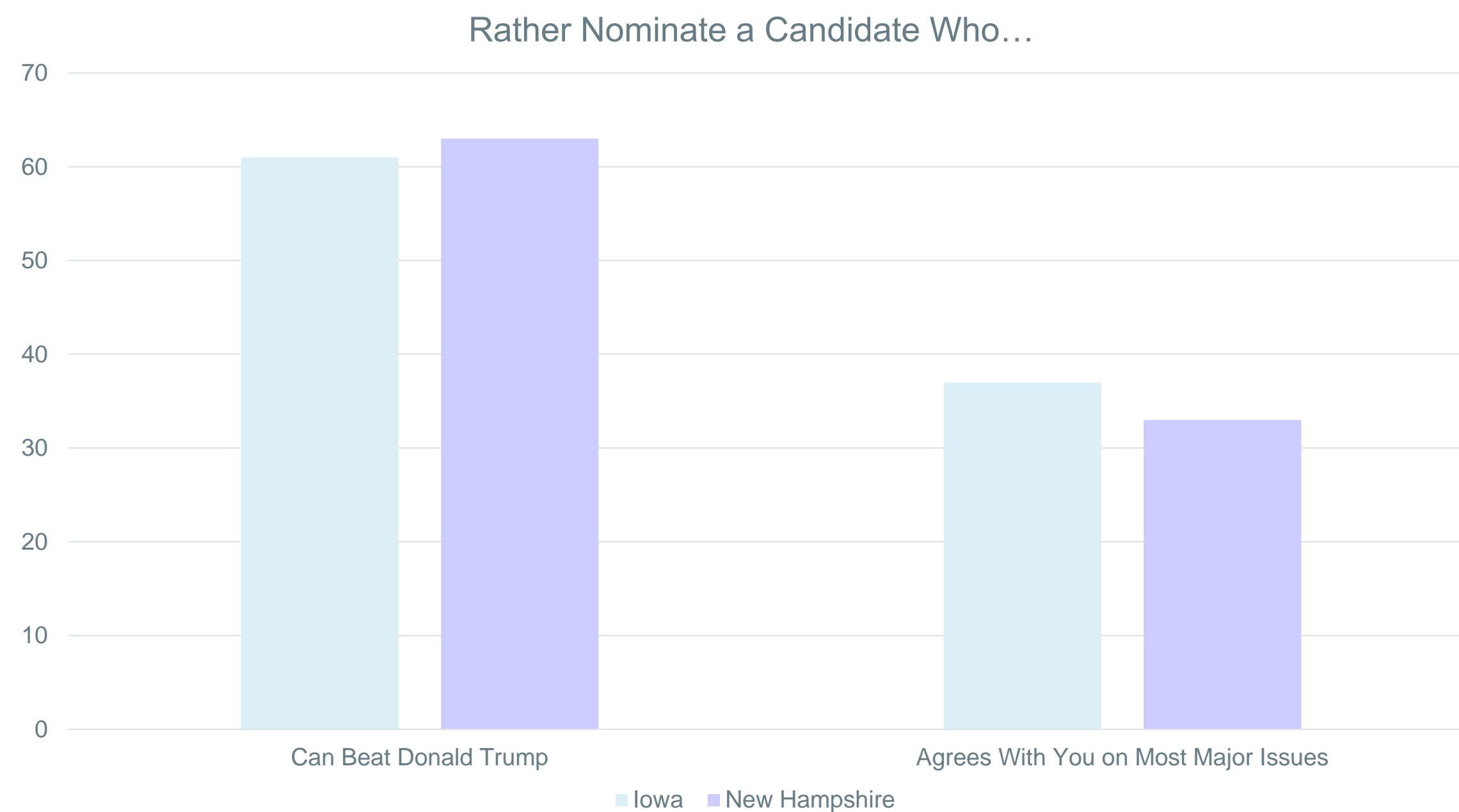
## Key Takeaways – Turnout

Turnout improved over 2016 but fell short of Democrats' expectations in an election where enthusiasm will be key. Given population growth since 2008, these gains look even worse.

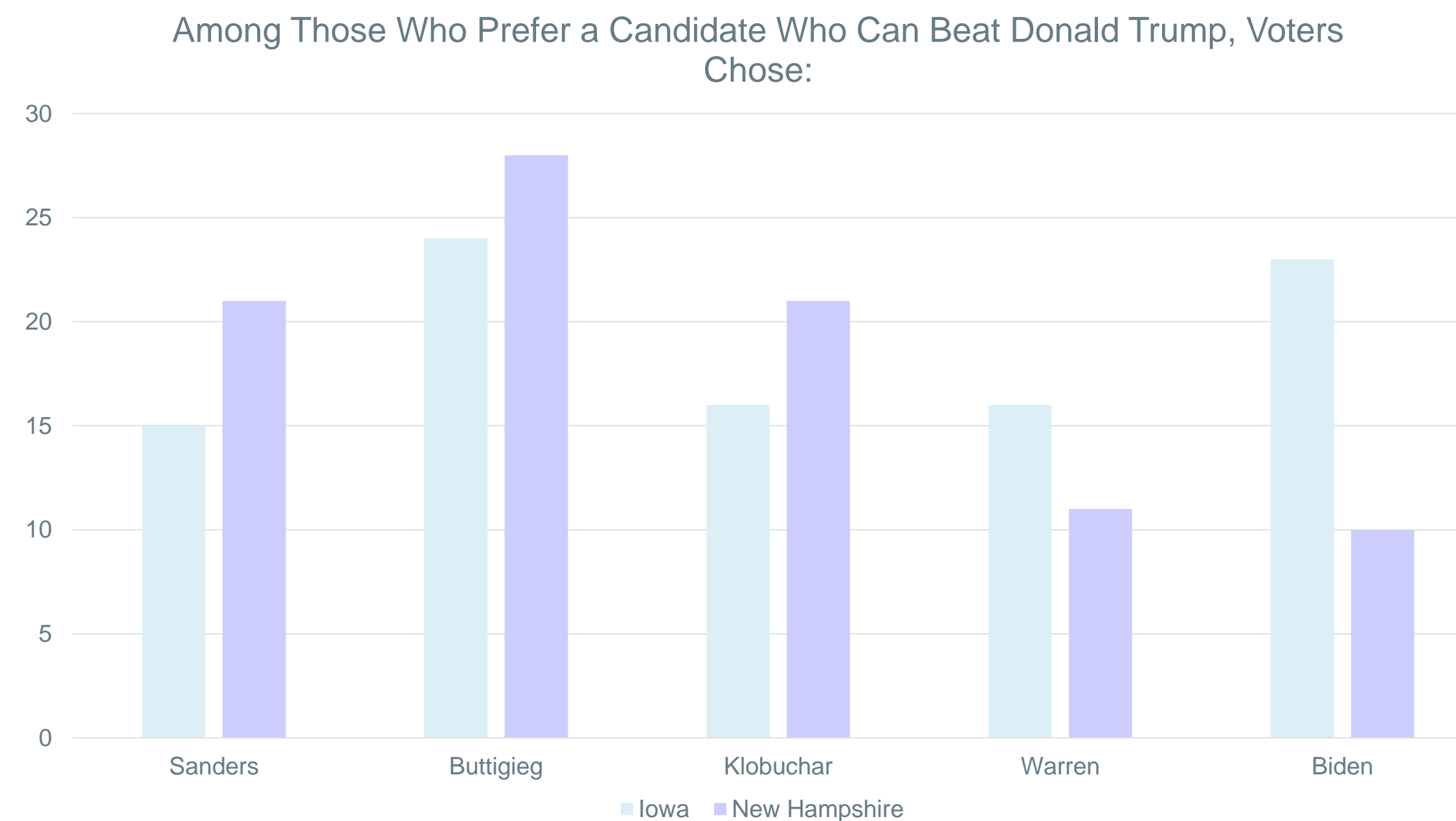


## Key Takeaways – Electability?

## There is Still No Dominant Frontrunner

The winner of Iowa and/or New Hampshire has traditionally gone on to emerge as the Democratic nominee.

- While Sanders and Buttigieg have fought for a close first and second place finish in both states, neither have fully pulled away from the pack.
- Super Tuesday could provide some clarity to the race, as **38 percent of delegates** will be awarded by the end of that day. With delegates awarded proportionally in all states, consistent small wins or strong second places could result in a formidable lead.

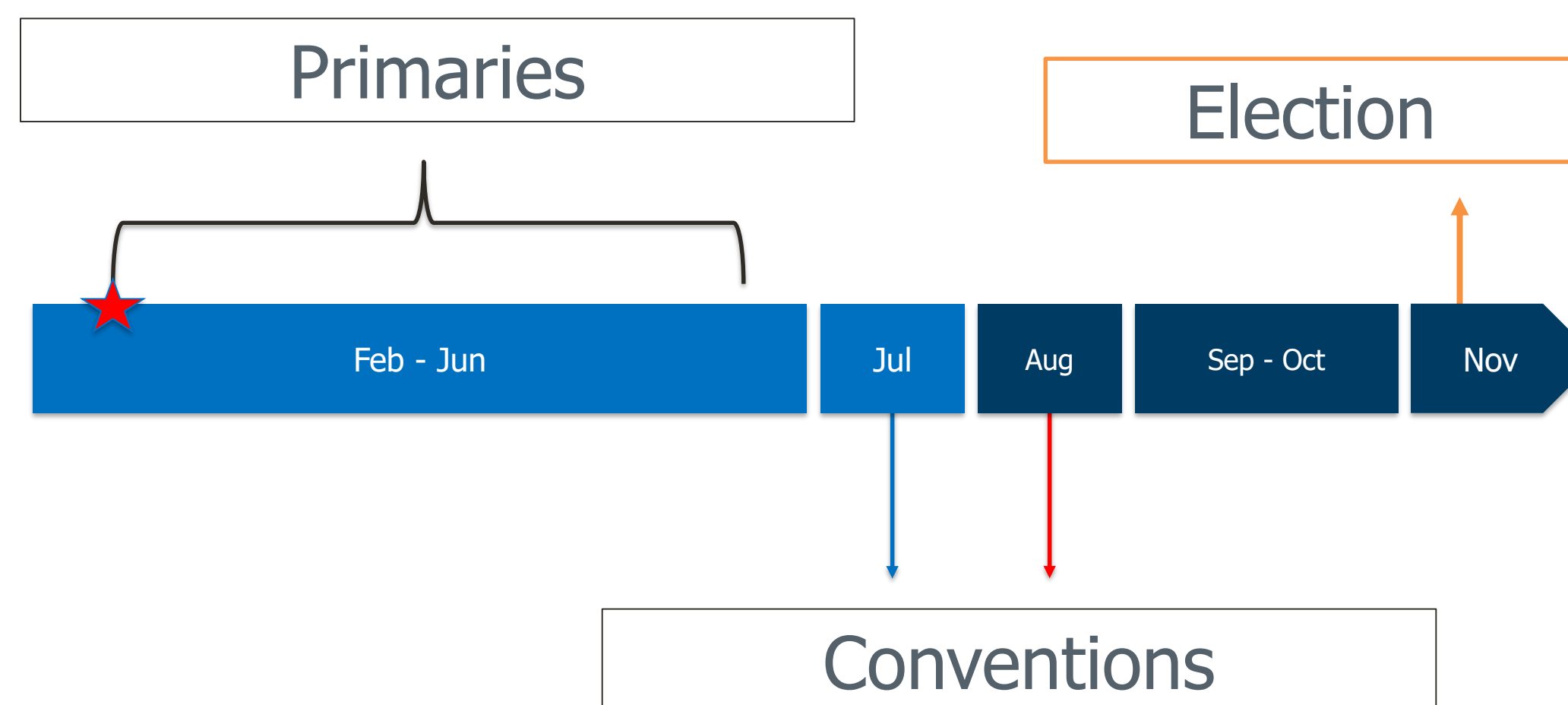
