A Close Look at the Online Conversation Inside the Beltway



The government shutdown is dominating Beltway social media engagement.

- 1 Sen. Schumer and Rep. Crockett drive the online conversation on the Democratic side. Rep. Mace and Sen. Kennedy lead social engagement on the right.
- 2 In the blame game, Republicans focus on paychecks, vets, and undocumented immigrants to add pressure.
- 3 Democrats rally around health care, health care, and more health care to push for compromise.





Fresh Voices Rise in Shutdown Talks, even as Old Guard Remains Front and Center

On the Democratic side of the aisle, Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer (D-NY) leads the pack in social engagement. Younger figures like Rep. Jasmine Crockett (D-TX) and Rep. Delia Ramirez (D-IL) are also in the top 10, signaling shifting Democratic voices in the debate. On the Republican side, Rep. Nancy Mace (R-SC) and Sen. John Kennedy (R-LA) — who sits on the Appropriations and Budget committees — lead in engagement.


Republicans Sound the Alarm, Pin the Blame on Democrats

Talk among Republicans highlights the negative consequences of a shutdown, including missed pay for members of the Armed Services and border patrol, service disruptions for seniors, and health care for undocumented immigrants. They accuse Democrats of avoiding passing a continuing resolution, calling their demands "ridiculous."





Top Republican Messaging



In the call for a clean continuing resolution, Republicans are focusing on health care access for illegal immigrants.


Democrats Tie Shutdown to Health Care Costs, Blame GOP for Stalled Negotiations

Health care costs are a central concern in the Democratic conversation about the shutdown, including the implications of proposed cuts to Medicaid and Affordable Care Act tax credits for Americans. Democrats critique their Republican counterparts for canceling votes and called out President Trump for delaying meeting with leaders on the left to discuss steps to prevent a shutdown.





Top Democratic Messaging



Democrats blame the shutdown on the perceived refusal to negotiate by Republicans, arguing that the GOP is "playing political games with American lives."





"The government is officially shut down. Make no mistake:
Republicans control the House, the Senate, and the White House.
This is THEIR shutdown. They had every tool to govern and chose chaos instead. The American people are the ones paying the price."
